Catholic Charities Diocese of Nashville is seeking candidates for one full time Program Specialist in the area of Mental Health in our County Expansion/Tennessee Serves Neighbors Program. This program is funded through the Tennessee Department of Human Services from a surplus of TANF dollars. The position will be based in and will cover Marshall County. This is a full-time position, working 37.5 hours per week from 8:00am-4:30pm Monday through Friday, with some flexibility required.

This position will provide office-based therapy and support services to low-income clients and families. The primary function of this position will be providing trauma informed individual, group, and family counseling by formulating and implementing treatment plans for each client.

Education/Experience:

- Clinical Master's Degree in Social Work or related field.
- Clinical License (LCSW, LPC, LMFT) preferred.
- 2+ years of experience in trauma-informed service to individuals and families.
- Knowledge and experience interfacing with schools, state government, etc. preferred.

- Good computer skills including working knowledge of Microsoft Office software and other database reporting systems.
